


Otdvent



Suicide Loss Grief Group

The Apostolate sponsored a 4-part series, led by certified grief counselor Peg Weber, for those who have suffered the loss of a loved one by suicide. We plan to offer another one of these groups in the spring. If you or someone you know would be interested in more information, please email the APD. During this group we often heard iterations of: "I don't want to have to be here, nobody wants to be here, but I'm grateful for this group of people who understand my grief and I know I'm where God wants me to be."

On October 15, the Sunday after World Mental Health Day (October 10) Bishop Hying celebrated the St. Dymphna Mental Health Mass. This Mass was for all who have experienced or are experiencing mental illness, support persons, and health care providers. After the Mass, there was an opportunity for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick to be received by anyone who so desired as well as a reception. The Lord's healing presence was felt throughout the day. Thank you to all who attended and participated in this day and to all who shared their talents in the beautiful liturgy. Over the weekend of September 29 - October 1, over 1,000 people gathered at St. John the Baptist Church in Waunakee for the Diocese of Madison's first ever Eucharistic Congress. This Congress aimed to remind the faithful of how truly present Christ is in the Eucharist. It was a beautiful weekend, filled with countless opportunities to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. Speakers from all over the country shared stories and insights into Eucharistic life, the Eucharistic Miracles Display was set up, Mass was held daily, and Adoration was held frequently. The weekend culminated with a Eucharistic procession, symbolizing each and every person's call to bring Jesus, who we receive in the Eucharist, out into the world through our words and actions. The Apostolate had a table at the event, where we highlighted reception of the Sacraments for persons with disabilities and how we are striving to give people with disabilities in the Diocese of Madison opportunities, resources, and skills to live out their Sacramental lives through inclusion and participation in their local pastorates. We are grateful for this opportunity and for the desire of those planning the Congress to include persons with disabilities by doing their best to make accommodations as needed.
